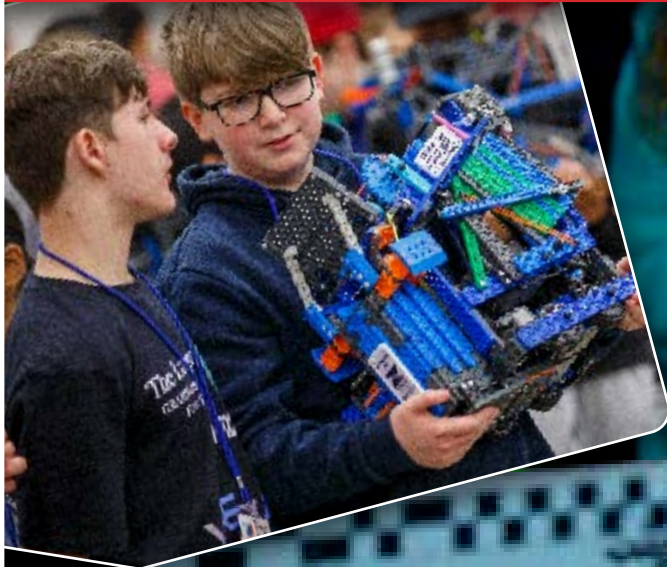


YOU CAN HELP DEVELOP THE NEXT GENERATION OF STEM TALENT

In VEX Robotics competitions, students from the ages of 8 to 18, form teams in school and work together collaboratively to strategise, research, design, build and code a robot.

They then attend local and regional events competing with - and against - teams of their peers. The season runs alongside the school year, typically starting in September through to the UK National Championships in March and then, for some teams, the possibility of a trip to the United States to compete on the global stage at the VEX Robotics World Championships!

Involvement in the competitions can develop students to be industry-ready. Beyond the academic development, they are expanding skills in so many areas;

Raise Awareness of your Organisation
